Jack Lumpkin protégé Davis Love III and Wayne Levi were two of the first Tour players to use the Medicus swing trainer. Levi began using the Medicus and he won four times. High profile teachers including Butch Harmon and Rick Smith began using Medicus, with Harmon becoming one of the company's largest accounts.

When Lumpkin gets a student that has difficulty taking the club away correctly, he gives them the Medicus to work with. "Medicus really helps that, simply because if you do it incorrectly it breaks." He also notes that, "This training aid is important for good players because even they get off from time to time. The other thing I think it does well, it

encourages the proper rhythm and the proper grip pressure.

And if a person's swing is too fast, they tend to break it. But if you swing in a rhythmic way, without the pressure changing and go through the proper swing plane, the Medicus does not break. I haven't seen anybody that the Medicus would hurt. It helps everybody."

Training with Medicus

The swing trainer comes complete with an instructional DVD, an instructional manual and a bonus "Top Tips DVD (see insert) featuring the Medicus teaching staff. The manual details nine potential breakpoints in the golf swing that Medicus will point out as well as key elements of the set up including grip, stance, posture and alignment. In sequence, for each of the nine breakpoints, pictures along with descriptions of the proper motions are followed by multiple illustrations detailing faults common to that segment of the swing.

Mark O'Meara

The crowning achievement among his 16 PGA Tour victories was winning both the Masters and British Open in 1998. Only a handful of players have won multiple major championships in the same calendar year. Owner of one of the most fluid golf swings in the game, Mark's consistency has allowed him to win the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am an amazing four times. O'Meara has represented the United States in three Ryder Cups, four Dunhill Cups and one Presidents Cup and in 1979, he won the U.S. Amateur.

Hank is one of Golf Magazine's Top 100 Teachers, is listed as Golf Digest's #5 instructor in the world and was the 1993 PGA of America Teacher of the Year. PGA Tour professional Mark O'Meara and LPGA Tour pro Kelli Keuhne are among his many professional students. Hank has always believed that golf is a game for everyone to enjoy. At his world-renown Hank Haney Golf Ranch, his philosophy is to accommodate any golfer with the desire to improve.

Bruce Fleisher

Already a winner on the PGA Tour, Bruce took the Champions (Senior PGA) Tour by storm. He was the first to win over \$2-million in single-season earnings in 2000. He was named Player of the Year, Rookie of the Year and won the Byron Nelson Trophy for lowest scoring average (69.19). Bruce tied a Tour record by winning seven official events his first year on the Senior Tour. Highlighting his numerous wins were the 2001 US Senior Open and 1968 US Amateur.

Jack Lumpkin

The 1995 PGA Teacher of the Year, Jack is currently instructing Davis Love III, Loren Roberts and the LPGA's Donna Andrews. Ranking #14 on Golf Digest's list of top instructors, Jack has been with Golf Digest Schools since 1976. He is currently the Director of Instruction at Sea Island Golf Club. He teaches many young and aspiring Tour professionals as well as amateurs of all handicap levels.

Kip Puterbaugh

Kip, head of instruction at the Aviara Golf Academy (Top 25 Golf School in America) is one of Golf Magazine's Top 100 Teachers. He works with numerous PGA Tour Players including Scott Simpson, Dennis Paulson and Larry Mize. Kip has a passion for working with and developing top junior players. Current prodigy Danielle Frasier recently won the U.S. Kids World Championship for 11 years olds. Kip received invaluable experience working with hall-of-fame instructor and two-time PGA champion Paul Runyan.

Every golfer has his or her own swing tendencies and the Medicus allows us to focus on faults specific to our own swing. Like most golfers, I have more than a few swing faults. I have a habit of lifting the club with my hands as opposed to using a proper turn to start the swing and my tempo often gets too quick. Beginning the swing with my hands takes me immediately off plane and requires manipulating the club to get it back to square at impact. If I lift my hands swinging the Medicus, the club breaks as soon as I begin the swing, highlighting my problem. I swung my Medicus just prior to playing last week and had an eagle and a hole-in-one in a four hole stretch! My swing was really smooth.
